STAFF UPDATE

Park Administrative Division

Parks & Recreation and Environmental Resources staff toured a cabin that was renovated into an Environmental Learning Center in Eden Prairie. Staff will use the information they learned to prepare cost estimates and design concepts for renovating the existing cabin at Ritter Farm Park.

Presidential Nomination Primary Information

Absentee ballots for the Presidential Nomination Primary (PNP) are available at Lakeville City Hall during regular business hours (Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.).

Before voting, election law requires that you select which major political party's ballot you want. If you refuse to select one party's ballot, you cannot vote. Your choice of major political party will not be public information, except that it will be made available to election officials and to the chairs of each major political party after the primary.
